1. Introduction

We aim to achieve our goals by providing content knowledge, a positive school ethos and a positive behavior approach which helps instill values, attitudes and behaviors that align with the expectations of ADEK.

The school will pursue extremely ambitious standards of teaching and learning and will invest extensive time and effort in the professional development of its teaching staff. To achieve these goals, teachers will seek to challenge and inspire students with high expectations; show good subject knowledge and understanding; plan to use a variety of teaching methods that will enable all students to reach their potential; plan the use of resources including teaching assistants; give clear and specific instructions and explanations; act promptly to address any inappropriate behaviour as well as praise pupils for effort and good behaviour.

At BPS, Al Ain, we want our children to be honest, respectful, considerate, and responsible. We expect them to demonstrate ambitious standards of behaviour, so that everyone can enjoy a happy, safe environment in which each individual feels respected and valued. The school community will:

- promote the values of honesty, trust, fairness, tolerance, compassion and politeness.
- reinforce positive behaviour at every opportunity.
- educate students to take responsibility for behaving in an appropriate manner.
- ensure that students understand that they are a valued part of the school community.
- ensure that students understand their role in school and in the wider community.
- discuss and share what constitutes acceptable behaviour through creating classroom rules.
- ensure that students are aware of the need to use their best behaviour both in class and during outdoor activities.
- ensure that students respect all cultures and religions.



2. Purpose and Scope

BPS, Al Ain, has implemented a Positive Behaviour Model to promote, recognise, reward, and reinforce positive behaviour. This model is grounded in the following principles:

Respect for UAE National Identity and Culture

All community members are expected to respect local values, traditions, religions, and culture, in alignment with ADEK's Values and Ethics Policy and Cultural Consideration Policy.

A Positive School Environment

BPS, AI Ain, is committed to maintaining a school environment that is welcoming, caring, safe, enriching, professional, and respectful to all, regardless of background, nationality, religion, ability, disability, race, or gender.

BPS, Al Ain, will educate all students on positive behaviour, including social-emotional development, self-management, emotional regulation, respect for diversity, and bullying prevention and intervention.

BPS, Al Ain, will ensure that educators receive training on the Student Behaviour Policy and the positive management of student behaviour.

Clear communication will be provided to parents regarding their role and obligations in promoting positive behaviour, in line with ADEK's Parent Engagement Policy.

Mechanisms and procedures will be in place to identify students at risk of engaging in, or who appear to be engaging in, misconduct or concerning behaviours.

Support, interventions, and procedures for dealing with misconduct and concerning behaviours will be implemented in accordance with Section 6 – Support and Interventions.



Aims

- To ensure that all children are happy and are supported to develop internal appreciation of themselves and their character traits.
- To promote the development of good character through reinforcement of the values program.
- To reward children for good behaviour and enable them to learn from their mistakes instead of being punished.
- To create an environment where children are respected, supported, and encouraged.

3. Student Code of Conduct

BPS, Al Ain, will promote positive behaviour among students through the establishment of a Student Code of Conduct, which will include the following elements:

Actions Defining Positive Behaviour

- 1. Show due care and respect for the school, its staff, students, and the wider community by:
 - Complying with all school policies and expectations.
 - Behaving safely and responsibly, considering the safety and welfare of oneself and others.
 - Caring for the school's property, facilities, and the property of others.
- 2. Represent the school positively during public occasions by:
 - Demonstrating good manners and wearing the correct school uniform.
- 3. Demonstrate a positive mindset and engagement with learning by:
 - Attending school and classes on time and providing explanations for lateness or absences.



- Ensuring copy books and textbooks are brought to school on a daily basis.
- Fulfilling all responsibilities as a learner with a strong work ethic, honesty, and a willingness to learn.
- Behaving responsibly and respectfully to avoid disrupting others' learning.
- Engaging in extracurricular learning opportunities.
- 4. Show consideration, respect, and civility to others, including staff, students, parents, and the wider community, by:
 - Speaking politely and behaving courteously.
 - Queuing orderly and respecting others' positions in queues.
 - Respecting personal space and boundaries, including seeking consent before touching or using others' belongings.
 - Acting as a responsible school citizen by not engaging in misconduct, protecting others from bullying, and intervening or reporting incidents of misconduct.
 - Demonstrating sportsmanship in both winning and losing.
 - Considering the impact of words and actions on others.
 - Following good hygiene practices.
 - Being vigilant in caring for and mentoring younger students when appropriate.
 - Encouraging environmental awareness and sustainable practices.
 - Promoting teamwork and inclusivity, particularly toward marginalised students.
 - Dressing modestly and appropriately, following the school's uniform policy and procedures.
 - Respecting UAE national identity and cultural values in line with ADEK's Cultural Consideration Policy.
 - Recognising and respecting the diversity within the school and wider community, refraining from discrimination based on ethnicity, nationality, culture, language, religion, gender, or ability/disability, in line with ADEK's Values and Ethics Policy.
 - Respecting educators and following instructions.



Expectations for Positive Behaviour

Students are expected to exhibit positive behaviour while under the school's supervision, including during school transportation, transitions, and all school-organised activities, both inside and outside school premises. The school may extend the Student Code of Conduct to situations where students indirectly represent the school, such as when wearing the school uniform in public settings.

Misconduct Policy and Procedures

- 1. BPS AI Ain, will apply positive behaviour approaches when addressing learner misconduct, focusing on understanding the factors contributing to the behaviour and providing necessary support before resorting to disciplinary measures.
- 2. The Misconduct Policy will distinguish between different levels of misconduct, following the guidelines in Article 7 of Ministerial Resolution No.(851) of 2018.
- 3. A Behavioural Management Committee will be formed to review and address learner behavioural concerns. Disciplinary actions will be fair, equitable, and appropriate to the learner's age, ability, and the severity of the misconduct.
- 4. BPS AI Ain, will outline mechanisms to help students identify and rectify negative behaviours before disciplinary action is taken.
- Disciplinary actions may include discussions with students and parents, formal meetings, warnings, supervised detention, and, in extreme cases, suspension or expulsion. However, BPS, Al Ain, will not use corporal punishment, psychological punishment, or other prohibited methods as disciplinary actions.
- 6. An appeals procedure will be in place, allowing parents to challenge disciplinary decisions, with a clear process and timelines for resolution.



Bullying Prevention

BPS AI Ain, will develop and implement a Bullying Prevention Policy in line with the National Policy for the Prevention of Bullying in Educational Institutions and ADEK's Student Protection Policy. This policy will include provisions for educating students and staff on identifying bullying, establishing prevention strategies, and outlining procedures for addressing bullying behaviour.

3. The Behavioural Management Committee

Formation of the Behavioural Management Committee

The Behavioural Management Committee at BPS, Al Ain, is established to oversee and manage student behavioural issues in alignment with the school's policies and values. The committee is formed as follows:

Composition of the Committee

- **Principal (or Delegate):** The Principal chairs the committee and may designate a senior staff member to act as their representative if necessary.
- **Teaching Staff Member:** At least one member of the teaching staff, preferably someone with significant experience or a role in student welfare, such as a Head of Year or a department head.
- Social Care Team Member: A representative from the social care team, such as a social worker, student supervisor, or the school's wellbeing lead, who provides expertise in student welfare and behaviour management.
- Child Protection Coordinator: This role is essential for addressing any issues related to student safety and ensuring compliance with child protection policies. If this role is filled by a



member of the social care team, the committee may consist of three members, at the school's discretion.

Selection Process

- Appointment by the Principal: The members of the committee are appointed by the Principal at the beginning of each academic year, ensuring that individuals with the necessary expertise and commitment to student welfare are chosen.
- Expertise Consideration: The selection process considers the experience, knowledge, and skills of the staff members, particularly in behaviour management, student welfare, and educational leadership.
- Inclusion of Specialists: Where specific behavioural issues require specialised knowledge, the committee may invite additional members, such as special education needs (SEN) coordinators, to participate in discussions and decision-making.

Role of the Behavioural Management Committee

The Behavioural Management Committee at BPS, Al Ain, plays a pivotal role in maintaining a positive school environment and ensuring that student behaviour aligns with the values and standards of the school. The committee's responsibilities include:

Reviewing Behavioural Concerns

The committee reviews cases of student misconduct brought to its attention. This includes analysing the context and severity of the behaviour, considering any mitigating circumstances, and assessing whether the behaviour aligns with the established code of conduct.



Implementing Disciplinary Actions

Based on their assessment, the committee decides on appropriate disciplinary actions, ensuring that these are fair, equitable, and proportionate to the level of misconduct. The actions should be in line with the guidelines set out in the Student Behaviour Policy and the Misconduct Policy and Procedures.

Ensuring Fairness and Consistency

The committee is responsible for ensuring that all disciplinary actions are applied consistently across the student body. This includes making sure that similar cases of misconduct receive similar consequences and that all decisions are made impartially.

Supporting Positive Behaviour

The committee works to promote positive behaviour by providing support and interventions for students who exhibit challenging behaviour. This includes working with students to understand the root causes of their behaviour, engaging them in behaviour management strategies, and providing social, emotional, and educational support.

Engaging Stakeholders

The committee communicates and collaborates with teachers, parents, and other stakeholders as necessary to address behavioural issues. This includes organising and conducting formal meetings, providing updates on behavioural cases, and involving relevant parties in the decision-making process.

Documenting and Reporting

The committee ensures that all incidents of misconduct, disciplinary actions, and interventions are properly documented. This documentation is crucial for tracking behavioural



trends, evaluating the effectiveness of interventions, and reporting to relevant authorities, including ADEK when necessary.

Appeals and Reviews

The committee manages the appeals process for disciplinary actions. They review appeals submitted by students or parents, reconsider the decisions made, and issue final resolutions in a timely manner. The committee is also responsible for reviewing and updating the Student Behaviour Policy annually to ensure it remains effective and relevant.

Emergency Response

The committee is prepared to convene at any time to address urgent behavioural issues. This includes responding to situations that require immediate intervention to maintain the safety and wellbeing of students and staff.

Confidentiality

The committee upholds strict confidentiality regarding all matters of student behaviour. All information discussed and decisions made within the committee are to be kept private and shared only with those directly involved, as required.

Collaboration with Inclusion Support

In cases involving students with additional learning needs, the committee collaborates closely with the Head of Inclusion to ensure that disciplinary actions are appropriate and consider any special educational needs that may affect the student's behaviour.

The Behavioural Management Committee is essential in fostering a supportive, respectful, and safe learning environment at BPS, Al Ain, ensuring that all students are guided towards positive behaviour and personal growth.



4. Rewarding Positive Behaviour

There will be a comprehensive and carefully structured system of rewards established to actively promote and recognise outstanding student behaviour across the school. These rewards are designed to celebrate and reinforce positive conduct, helping to foster a sense of pride, motivation, and belonging amongst our students. Examples of such rewards include formal public recognition during morning assemblies, where students' achievements and efforts are highlighted and celebrated in front of their peers. In addition, students may receive Certificates of Achievement to acknowledge and commemorate their exemplary behaviour and contributions.

House Points will also be awarded as part of this system, contributing to the overall success of students' Houses and encouraging a sense of teamwork and healthy competition that culminates in end-of-year celebrations and awards. Within classrooms, students who consistently demonstrate positive behaviour will be acknowledged and praised by their teachers, promoting a culture of respect, encouragement, and shared values throughout the school community.

Beyond these core rewards, a variety of further celebratory initiatives will be implemented. These may include the presentation of special badges for those who consistently role-model the school's values and expectations, sending positive behaviour postcards home to parents or guardians to share and celebrate their child's success, and providing invitations to reward trips, enrichment opportunities, or special events as a mark of appreciation. Students may also be featured in the school newsletter or highlighted on the school's social media channels to showcase their positive contributions and achievements to the wider community.

Through this broad and thoughtful range of positive reinforcement strategies, the school is committed to creating a supportive and aspirational environment in which all students feel valued, motivated, and inspired to display exemplary behaviour, enabling them to flourish both academically and personally.



5. Records and Reporting

BPS, Al Ain, will keep records of all learner misconduct, including root cause analyses, intervention measures, and disciplinary procedures. Confidentiality will be maintained, and all level 2, 3, and 4 misconduct will be reported to ADEK.
