



UNIFORM POLICY

2023 - 2024

1. Introduction

We want our children to feel proud of their school and the way they present themselves. This is reflected in a number of ways, one of these being through school dress. Whilst we accept the need for individuality, choice-making and diversity in many aspects of school life in order to create a harmonious and safe teaching and learning environment, we have adopted a school uniform.

The school uniform should be practical, affordable and keeping in with the school's values, mission and philosophy.

2. Practicality

Uniform is designed to allow for participation in the range of activities that one would normally expect within the school day. For certain activities at certain ages and stages some additional items (e.g. specialist sport kit) may be required.

Given the range of school activities our uniform is designed to accommodate such changes.

The school uniform takes into account normally expected weather conditions and requirements for hot and cold weather will form part of the uniform.

We are mindful of the practical considerations for our younger students and have ensured that the uniform is manageable for them. We believe that uniform can be an excellent way to teach independent skills of dressing/undressing.

The school uniform should be seen as being robust, everyday wear and should be sourced appropriately to ensure it allows parents maximum convenience in terms of preparation and presentation

3. Affordability

The school has chosen a balance between bespoke items and those which can be sourced generically in order to minimize cost to parents whilst still maintaining a distinctive outlook. In considering affordability, the school has chosen to maintain styles and items across most year groups with the exceptions noted below.

4. Health and Safety

We must ensure that our students are dressed in a way that allows for all activities to be undertaken in the safest possible way. Regular school activities include a robust programme of outdoor games and activities.

5. School Uniform Requirements

- Full uniform must be worn on all school days and occasions (unless notified by the Principal) in accordance with the uniform descriptions.



- No variations, other than those as stated in Section 7: Appendix A, will be permitted unless notified by the Principal.
- Physical Education (PE) requires a set uniform, these are stated in Section 7: Appendix A. No variations will be accepted unless notified by the Principal.
- Any uniform accessories e.g. hair slides, clips, etc. must be plain and in keeping with the uniform colours.
- Hair must be of uniform colour, no extreme styles and long hair must be tied back and kept off the face.
- All items must be clearly labelled.
- The school shoes as recommended MUST be adhered to. Shoes that are not as outlined which are deemed to be a health and safety risk will be required to be replaced.

6. Compliance

- We expect that all parents and students will comply with the standards of dress and presentation required on all occasions.
- If there are repeated occurrences of uniform standards falling below our expectations, then parents will be notified and asked to rectify the issue. See Section 8: Appendix B.

8. Appendix B: Uniform Infringement Process:

Students who refuse to follow the school uniform/dress code will have the following consequences:

1st Incident:	Verbal warning to students. Form teacher to send uniform reminder message to parents
2nd Incident:	1 st Principal Warning Letter with uniform policy sent to parents.
3rd Incident:	2 nd Principal Warning Letter with uniform policy sent to parents. Parents called for meeting with the Principal and Social Worker.
4th Incident:	ADEK Level One Warning Letter issued to parents. Parents are requested to bring in correct uniform.
5th Incident:	ADEK Level 2 Warning Letter issued to parents. Parents requested to collect child and return only with full uniform.
